Namaste! We are diving into the project planning phase of the trip preparation, and we have already been very inspired and excited by your energy and ideas. Important action items!

- Read all the information in this newsletter!
- **Book** your international flight and **apply** for your visa!
- If you have not already done so, submit the following as soon as possible:
 - Your international flight information via the following link: <u>http://goo.gl/forms/Cct6SqvomB</u>
 - Signed release forms (attached) -- for each member of your party -- to Joao via email to joao.aleixo@yale.edu or fax to 203-432-0587.
 - Photos for our participant directory via email to Najib at <u>kakelao2015@gmail.com</u>.
- **Check** your passport. Does it expire within 6 months after date of arrival in India? If so, you might need to renew your passport before applying for your visa. Confirm this information now and consult with a travel expert if you have questions!
- **Review** the list in this newsletter of participants going on the extensions and **contact us** immediately if you see a mistake or if you would like to join the new pre-trip Sri Lanka extension.
- Talk with your doctor about immunizations and other medications including anti-malarials -- you might need for the trip.
- **Connect** with your project leaders if you haven't done so yet.

Orientation summary



We had a small but very spirited group at our orientation session in New Haven on April 18th. Below is a capsule summary of the key presentations from orientation day and a link to all the visual presentations:

- Puneet Batra, producer of the 2014 Kakelao trip, provided us with a pre-recorded slide show and commentary giving an **overview of India**.
- Shona Hemmady and Hun Wong, Yale undergraduates who interned for a month in Jodhpur and Kakelao helping prepare for last summer's trip, gave a presentation describing **daily life in Jodhpur and Kakelao**.
- We provided a PowerPoint presentation describing our **Indian partners** and giving a **summary of the 2014 projects**.
- We spent the afternoon in small groups discussing plans for the specific projects. Many project leaders were able to attend orientation, and we sent summaries of project-specific discussions to the project leaders who were not able to attend. Project leaders will share these discussions with their individual teams.

The Nepal earthquake and a new Pre-trip Extension to Sri Lanka

We are of course all very sad about the tragic earthquake in Nepal. We have been in touch with our partners in India and confirmed that none of them was directly affected by these events. However, we have had to cancel our planned pre-trip extension to Nepal. Nonetheless, Far Horizon has offered a very exciting alternate trip to Sri Lanka. The itinerary is attached; the cost of the trip is \$1,450 per person, double occupancy, with a \$400 single room supplement. If any of you who had not already been planning to go to Nepal is interested in joining the pre-trip to Sri Lanka, please contact Melissa and Najib no later than Wednesday, May 6th.

Reminder: When should you plan to arrive in and leave from New Delhi? What are the luggage restrictions on our internal flights?

Beginning of the trip

Arrival schedule

If you are not going on the pre-trip extension to Sri Lanka, please plan to arrive in New Delhi on July 30th. We have booked rooms for the night of July 30th at a hotel near the New Delhi airport. For those participants who arrive <u>at 9am or later on July 30th</u>, Far Horizon, our logistics partner, will provide transportation from the airport in New Delhi to the hotel – but only if you provide us with your flight details. Check-in at the hotel begins at 2pm; you might be able to access your room earlier than 2pm subject to availability.

If you are going on the pre-trip extension to Sri Lanka, please plan to arrive in Colombo by July 25th. For those participants who arrive in Colombo<u>at 9am or later on July 25th</u>, Far Horizon will provide transportation from the airport in Colombo to the hotel – but only if you provide us with your flight details. You will join the group in New Delhi on July 30th.

As we have described in the first newsletter, the internal flights we will be taking have **strict luggage weight restrictions,** so you will need to pack thoughtfully. Specifically, keep in mind that on the July 31st flight from New Delhi to Jodhpur, you will be able to check only one bag up to 15 kilograms (approximately 33 pounds) and carry on only one bag up to 7kg (approximately 15.4 pounds). Excess luggage will be sent via bus to Jodhpur; this bus will leave from the hotel at **6pm on July 30th**. Pack accordingly – or leave time to repack your suitcases as needed after your arrival. If you arrive at the hotel after 6pm on July 30th AND your luggage exceeds the limitations, you will likely be charged excess fees on the flight to Jodhpur, at the rate of INR 300 (roughly \$5) per excess kg.



End of the trip

If you are not going on the Golden Triangle extension, the trip ends on August 9th. The flight from Jodhpur to New Delhi (with the same luggage restrictions as above but with no option to have excess baggage travel by bus) will get you into New Delhi in the early afternoon, in time for late night international flights. Please note that we are not providing any additional services (transport, hotel, sightseeing, etc.) upon arrival at the airport in New Delhi. Check-in for your international flights is permitted four hours before departure.

If you are going on the Golden Triangle extension, the trip ends August 13th in New Delhi, so you can plan to leave from New Delhi that night, and we will arrange for transport to the airport for late-night departures.

Additional services

For participants arriving in New Delhi/Colombo earlier than the dates and times listed above or staying in New Delhi after the end of the service trip or Golden Triangle extension, if you would like to arrange additional services such as airport transfers, additional nights in the hotels, or sightseeing tours, you can contact our partners at Far Horizon: Raman Gulati at <u>raman@farhorizonindia.com</u> and Pankaj Arora at <u>pankaj@farhorizonindia.com</u>. Please note that you will need to arrange payment for these additional services as they are not included in the cost of the trip.
