
This is the first of a few important Newsletters that you will receive leading up to departure. The Newsletters contain pertinent information regarding travel, project assignments, itinerary, and much more. Please take the time to read them.

My name is Liz Jordan '88 and I am your Trip Leader for this program. The rest of the Team includes Director of Yale Alumni Service Programs, João Aleixo, our ground partner NGO, Amandla Development and its Director Scott Clarke 02', as well as our local logistics coordinator, Spirit of Africa.

A brief background on myself: This will be my fourth YASC trip as a volunteer. I was a YASC volunteer in Brazil in 2017 and Public Health project leader for the 2018 Brazil trip. Last year I led the Women's Health project in Cape Town. I am a practicing OB-GYN hospitalist in Seattle, Washington and have a particular interest in global health.

Joining us on this year's trip again is the esteemed, João Aleixo. He is Director of Yale Alumni Service Programs having led YASC since its inception in 2008. He has been on numerous YASC trips and he is an invaluable part of our team.

TRAVEL TO AND FROM CAPE TOWN

It is time to start booking your flights to Cape Town if you have not already done so. You are responsible for booking your international flights to and from Cape Town. Airfare and travel arrangements are not included in the YASC registration fee. Note that unlike last year, you are also responsible for arranging your own transportation to the Vineyard Hotel from the airport.

The hotel is a short distance from the Cape Town airport and is accessible by Taxi or Uber. Volunteers are expected to arrive by the afternoon of **Thursday**, **July 25th** There will be dinner provided Thursday evening. The program will end after breakfast **on Sunday**, **August 4th**. All other transportation that is part of the program itinerary is provided by YASC. Trip insurance is strongly advised and not provided by YASC. Trip insurance can protect you from unattended medical emergencies or changes in your travel plans. We advise you to inquire with your health insurance provider as well for overseas health coverage policies. Unfortunately, YASC cannot recommend certain insurance vendors. Your air carrier may provide the option to purchase trip insurance or you may also consider comparing trip insurance vendors. ACCOMMODATIONS

We will be staying at the lovely and picturesque Vineyard Hotel, in the Newlands neighborhood of Cape Town. YASC expects ALL volunteers to stay at the **Vineyard Hotel** with the group during the dates of the program. Many of the program events, project planning, as well as meals occur on the hotel premise. If you decide to stay at the Vineyard additional dates beside the specified program dates, you may book your rooms by emailing Cailin Human from Spirit of Africa at: cailin@spiritofafrica.co.za (this way you will be able to obtain the group discounted rate). Room and roommate assignments will be provided upon arrival at the Hotel.

WEATHER

It will be winter in Cape Town when we arrive. The weather will be variable from hour to hour. I recommend bringing layers of clothing and prepare for some rain. Unlike last year, we are not anticipating a drought. In Cape Town in July/August average temperature are highs in the mid 60's and lows in the mid 40's.

VISAS

The great news is that if you are a US citizen, a VISA is not required to enter South Africa. You do need a valid passport so make sure your passport is not expired or expiring during the trip. You should also ensure that you have at least 2 empty pages in your passport.

TRAVELING WITH A MINOR

Very Important info about traveling into South Africa with a minor:

If both parents are traveling with a minor, you MUST bring an original copy of the child's birth certificate, and in the event the child is traveling with only one parent, you must bring IN ADDITION to the birth certificate, an affidavit of consent. PLEASE refer to the US Embassy website for more details about traveling with minors. Your child will not be allowed in the country if the appropriate documents are not present upon entrance at customs. Other travel
