## YASC in Peru 2023 Program Policies

CHILDREN: Families are welcome and encouraged to attend with the following restrictions: all children 18 and under must be accompanied by a parent, grandparent, legal guardian or adult with proper authorization; all children under the age of 14 must have a parent participating in the same community throughout the duration of the program; we cannot accommodate any children under the age of 12 on the program.

FOOD: The communities and the people of Nauta primarily serve chicken, fish, rice, potatoes and plantains and cannot source many other foods. Although the organizers hope to be able to accommodate dietary restrictions, it might not be possible. If you want or need (due to dietary restrictions for any reason) other types of food, you will bring your own snacks.

ACCOMMODATIONS/ROOMS: YASC in Peru promises to be an extraordinary experience with our visits to the small communities along the Marañon for the week. There are also some special features compared to other YASC trips. Please acknowledge that you understand and accept the following conditions:

- my hotel room, as is the norm in the hot climate of Nauta, will not have hot water;
- most rooms do not have central air conditioning,
- all rooms have fans.

COVID, HEALTH, MEDICAL: I will abide by the YAA/Yale University and Peru requirements as provided to me prior to the trip. All participants must follow US and local health and medical policies as appropriate. I will abide by the Terms and Conditions available on the website and the registration.

YASC CODE OF CONDUCT: Every participant on this program will be required to read, acknowledge, and sign the YASC Volunteer Code of Conduct. This important document communicates the values of Yale and YASC with respect to service trips, delineates the expectations for volunteers, and the commitment by service trip volunteers to adhere to all policies and procedures.
